PASTOR PETE'S ARTICLE



Facebook likes to remind us of posts that we have made in the past. Many of those pictures were from when we lived in Bemidji, and I think that every single year there was at least one picture of snow in October. Every time I saw one, I thought, "Boy, I sure am glad that we moved south last November!!" And then, on Halloween, we woke up to snow on the ground. As long as it's not the snow of Halloween in 1991, I guess that I can live with it. It is still early, it will warm up and the snow will melt and when December rolls around, we will probably be wondering if a White Christmas will only be in our dreams.

Well, it's been a year since you called me to be your pastor. And what a year it has been!!!! Thank you for welcoming my family and me into your church, your homes, and your community! We love living in Ellsworth and we are so blessed to be here. From the bottom of our hearts, THANK YOU!! We are still figuring each other out. Some of you are still not quite sure what to think of me. I know, I'm a little different from what you might expect from a pastor. I can be loud and goofy, and my sense of humor can be dry and self-deprecating, but please know that it comes from a sincere desire to bring a little bit of joy into this world.

When we watch the news, read the paper, and scroll through social media, it can seem like the world is going to hell-in-a-handbasket. I don't think that you are wrong, it probably is. HOWEVER, when we look back on history, it always looks like our world is that way. I can remember 15 years ago, when the retired guys at the golf course kept stopping at the 19th Hole, the bar at the golf course, to watch the news and see how bad the stock market was crashing and the aftermath that was left in its wake. I can remember a September morning, waking up to a screaming hangover and seeing the look on my parents' faces as we watched over and over, the video of planes flying into the Twin Towers and then seeing them come crashing down. Operation Desert Shield/Storm, Tianemin Square, the Iran Hostage Situation, ok, I was just a toddler when that happened. But what about the gas shortages of the 1970s? How many of you were concerned about your draft number when you graduated from high school and the Vietnam war? And before that, the fear of communists and the atom bomb. World War II, the Great Depression, World War I. World War I, the Great War, was to be the war that ended all wars... we know how false that was. Serving others helps us to take our minds off our struggles and opens our world to a whole new experience. Worshipping God gives us reprieve from the bombardment of awful news that it constantly around us. Reading the bible shows us that God has always been there with his people, even in the worst times. Even on the darkest days, there is joy and light to be found.

Once again, thank you for letting me be your pastor! I love you!!


