Be careful how you think; your life is shaped by your thoughts. Proverbs 4:23

What do you spend the most time thinking about each day? Your to-do list? The world's problems? Things that could go wrong in the future? The test or test result you're worried about?

Someone once said, "Believe. Behave. Become." Which is to say, if you believe in something, you will behave in ways which support that belief, so you might become one with that belief.

For example, if we believe the goal in life is to be the one who dies with the most toys, we will spend our life behaving in ways to accumulate more toys, at all costs, to the point we end up with lots of toys, but maybe not a generous heart or a loving family because that's not where our focus was.

Please NO electronics or large sporting goods. The Community Missions Team reserves the right to refuse any items.





September Council Notes





- † Fundraising for ELC: Approved 100% to individual sales, all else 75% to individuals working, 25% to group split proportionally depending on participation level of each activity. Binding policy for 2019 trips, camps, retreats. Proportion will be determined by 4/15/19.
- † Air Conditioner unit replacement– General Fund to be used for lowest bid.
- † Pastor Jeff's 2019 Health Allowance-Executive Committee discussion.
- † Design Ellsworth Approved Thrivent Choice funds in the amount of \$200.
- † Law Enforcement Education Materials- Gary Onan to get more information from the Police Department.
- † Mary Sokolik to take Council notes in Kristen Kinneman's absence until annual meeting in January.
- † Donation Station Ask Endowment Committee for funds after purchase of shed using General Fund.
- † Helen Jacobson Estate money can be moved: \$40,000 into Children's and \$40,000 into Women's budget line items. Balance for each group (@ \$39,941.00/each) goes into 2 separate endowments.
- † Fairstand funds- \$15k to General, \$1K to Synod Appeal, \$500 to Turning Point, \$500 to school lunches.



Soul ShopTM equips congregational leaders to minister to those impacted by suicidal desperation including:

- · Adults and youth who are considering suicide
- · Family members and friends who are anxious about a person who may be considering suicide
- · Persons who have lost a loved one to suicide
- Second Day people those who have been suicidal in the past but have found a way out of suicidal thinking

The intended audience is adults who interact with youth on a regular basis, including teachers, parents, coaches, grandparents, youth ministers and pastors.


