Pastor's Report

Sisters and Brothers in Christ of English Lutheran Church, every day I thank God for bringing us together! My time with you last year was short and other than being installed on November 19th, the only pastoral actions that I did was officiating the celebration of life for Don Beebe and I led the Christmas services at Preferred Living and Ellsworth Health Services. Otherwise, it has been a whirlwind of faces and names and trying to remember faces and put the right names to those faces. I have begun visitations and I look forward to meeting everyone.

The other day, I found two intriguing pieces in my office. One was a draft of the history of our church for the 75th anniversary in 1995 and the other was a stack of old picture directories. Report from Finance Committee

Committee Members: Gary Brown, Curt Dumermuth, Kris Flock, Sue Gulbranson, and Julie Gore

Mission Purpose: Review the financial reports of the congregation monthly for accuracy and provide recommendations to the council for any changes needed.

Overview of 2022 activity: Twenty-Twenty Two was another very interesting year for English Lutheran Church. Pastor Bunk served as our interim minister for most of 2022 as the congregation searched for a permanent replacement. Pastor Pete Warren answered our call and was installed on November 20, 2022. The Finance Committee worked with both individuals throughout the year to review the monthly reports and prepare recommendations to the church council.

In 2022 the church switched our donation software from a local PC based program to an online version of the system. The online version allows for cloud storage of information and updated software .

The IT equipment for English Lutheran Church was updated in 2022. Both office computers were replaced with new units as well as the network and WIFI system. The computers for the PowerPoint and streaming services were also replaced along with necessary switches. Once Pastor Pete accepted our call a new laptop computer was ordered and received to complete the IT update of our system. Funding for these IT updates was supplied from the 2021 church fair stand profits.

Tristan resigned her position as Financial Administrator in May and accepted a full-time position with an accounting firm. The Church Council decided to offer the position to Sydney in addition to her duties as the communication coordinator and she accepted. Tristan agreed to help train Sydney as she takes on this new task.

The Pierce County Fair stand was again successful in 2022 with profits of \$26,000

The Thrivent Investment account unfortunately took a hit this year as all investments have decreased in value. Hopefully we will see improvement in 2023.

Overall, the financial health of English Lutheran Church remains strong due to the faithful giving of the congregation. We will need to have this continued support in 2023 as our church grows with Pastor Pete in the Ellsworth Community.

Report from Malawi

Team Members: Over the years, Bobbie Sawyers has kept the Malawi team up and running. As she has moved away, we currently do not have an active team member to write this report. Below is an update on Malawi from the Synod.



Muli bwanji, friends.

Warm greetings on behalf of our partners and friends in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Malawi. Here are a few updates for you!

HEALTH

Since experiencing significant flooding in early 2022, the people of Malawi have been impacted by cholera. This disease, most commonly spread through contaminated water, has become widespread - nearly 20,000 confirmed cases and 661 deaths have been reported throughout the country. An oral vaccine effort is underway in the areas most severely impacted.

There is also a growing concern about mental health. As people/households experienced difficulties during the pandemic, and are now try to cope with severe economic crises, deaths by suicide have become more frequent and there are few resources for assessment or prevention.



PASTORS' ACADEMY

In May of 2022 we helped host the first hybrid Pastors' Academy with the ELCM. Although we could not teach lessons "live" during the academy due to the 8 hour time difference, we prepared pre-recorded lessons on video that they were able to view as a part of their on-site classes. Synod staff, the conference deans, and the participants of the academy in Malawi shared

an opening ceremony together via Zoom and we are so thankful for the gift of technology that allowed us to see and hear each other in real time.

WELLS

Malawi's current cholera outbreak reminds us of how important it is for all people to have access to clean water sources. I am so thankful to the individuals and congregations of this synod who continue to share gifts for the purpose of building wells in Malawi. In 2022 two new wells were completed, one in Lower Shire and one in Mangochi, and there is a 3rd well site currently being prepared. Well projects like these can change a community in several ways: physical health, access to education, safety, and equity are often positive outcomes.



Report from Malawi Continued

ELCM STRUCTURAL CHANGES

For the last few years the ELCM has been making plans to split into three dioceses in Malawi due to the growth of membership and subsequent leadership needed to support the congregations. In July of 2022 the ELCM announced the creation of a northern diocese, the *ELCM Diocese of Karonga*, and the election of its first bishop, Rev. Alick Msuku. Previously serving as a regional dean in the ELCM, he will now oversee the congregations in this new diocese, having been installed in November as the Rt. Rev. Alick Msuku. 40th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

40 years ago, in 1982, the first worship service in the ELCM was hosted in the home of Gilbert Steven Msuku - there were 11 in attendance. Present at this first worship servce was a small child, the son of G.S. Msuku, named Alick, now serving as the bishop of the Karonga Diocese in the ELCM. In November 2022 the ELCM formally celebrated 40 years together as a church. Hosted in tandem with the installation of Bishop Msuku, this celebration was attended by leaders and participants from Lutheran churches in Namabia, Zimbabwe, South Africa, Germany, and the ELCA/NWSWI. The Northwest Synod of Wisconsin has been blessed to be partnered with the ELCM for over half of this time and we pray for all the ways that God will continue to strengthen our ministry together.

Mission Endowment 2022 Annual Report

Endowment Committee Members: Warren Johnson, Chair (term ends 1-31-25), Peter Carr, Treasurer (term ends 1-31-24), Traci Maxwell, Secretary (term ends 1-31-23), Dixie Basch (term ends 1-31-24), Mary Sokolik (Term ends 1-31-25), Diane Wiskerchen (term ends 1-31-24), Trina Groen (term ends 1-31-25). Traci Maxwell's term is the only term set to expire this year. The length of one's term is 3 years for a maximum of 3 terms.

Endowment Mission Statement: Transforming lives by spreading God's love through Christ-Centered generosity.

2022 Summary:

Following Church guidelines and protocol, the Endowment Committee met on four occasions: 2/16/2022, 4/27/2022, 8/3/2022, and 11/2/2022.

I'm pleased to report that all of the distribution requests from various church committees were approved by this committee, so our goal of supporting our youth and outreach ministry was fulfilled.

We were able to supplement and expand our support for the Children's Education Account by asking Council to approve an expanded age of children in our church. After their approval of expanded age requirements, for purposes of the Endowment Fund, children are now considered to be infants to 18 years of age, which expands the definition to include 7th -12th grades. We also addressed the ongoing and increased needs the Sharing Shed has seen.

One area of importance I would like to clarify is just how the funding works for you and for all of the church, both inside and outside its walls. Some see personal money gifts at work only if there is a visual, tangible brick and mortar object to point to, so let me clarify how this is so much better. Through your Estate Planning or Will, or other money gift, you can designate where your ongoing gift to the church is to go, a gift which has no end. All monetary gifts given to the Endowment Fund take the interest accrued on your capital given, so your gifts really never get exhausted. Isn't that a great legacy to leave?

Currently, there are 3 categories which exist to offer your gifts. They are: the Children's Education Fund, the Women's Fund and the General Fund. Keep in mind, there is an ever-increasing need to help the General Fund, as there are many outward ministries needing our support. Monetary gifts given are not used to pay ongoing bills of the church, such as utilities, but are used to provide further ministry in our community, the surrounding areas, as well as to provide resources needed by individual people needing our help.

Goals for 2023:

For the coming year, we hope to continue dispersing gifts where needed and to increase our church outreach to those areas of need even more than last year. Another goal is to continue showing all what a valuable tool our church can be for others, not only in times of duress, but also in times of celebration. Let us remember Christ's command. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations…"

2022 Mission Endowment Fund Treasurer's Report

Mission Endowment funds are maintained in two separate accounts. The first is an investment account managed by the ELCA. Within that account there are separate accounts for a Children's Fund, a Women of ELCA Fund and a General Fund. The second account is a checking account referred to as the Mission Investment Fund checking account. Two major projects were worked on during 2022. First, was the demolition of the old youth house and second, the renovation of the bathrooms in the Sunday school edition. The youth house was used by the fire department for training in exchange for burning the structure down at no cost to the church (other than patience while waiting for training to be arranged and completed). Disposing of the foundation and leveling of the site was completed the last week of November, with final preparation and seeding to occur this coming spring.

The bathroom renovation was a lengthy process – interrupted by Covid, supply problems, and busy schedule for the contractor. The basement bathroom was converted into a storage room and the first

floor bathroom remodeled into a unisex bathroom – both are waiting for the finishing touches to be completed early in 2023. As usual with most projects some additional work was done "while we were at it" as the entire east wall was insulated to prevent some of the moisture problems that has plagued the paint in the stairwell for some time. Older windows were also replaced on the east wall. Donations to help offset some the additional expenses are welcome.
