PASTOR PETE'S ARTICLE



Last night, Wednesday, May 24th, I had the privilege of being part of the Baccalaureate Worship Service at Ellsworth High School. And while sitting in the cafetorium, I couldn't help but reminisce of my time, 27 years ago. (Did I just say 27 years ago?!?! How did I get so old so quickly?! As I sat there, I remembered my freshmen orientation to high school. As we sat in the Auditorium at Ashland High School, Mr. Blauert, the Vice Principal said to us, "The next 4 years of your lives will go by in the blink of an eye!" I thought, "Yeah, right." As I looked around the room, we all had that skeptical look in our eyes. Four years later, when I walked across that stage to accept my diploma and shake the superintendent's hand, I thought, "Son of a gun, Mr. Blauert was right!" I'm glad that was the last mistake that I ever made... (and if you believe that, I have some ocean front property in Arizona that I will sell to you for a great price!)

At the Baccalaureate service, the last speaker was Mr. Stoesz, the former high school principal, and he talked about failure and reassured the students that it was okay to fail, in fact, they will fail at various times in their lives. It is weird to think that failure can be a good thing, but it is in those moments that we can learn the most. We can take a step back and try it again from a different angle. And eventually, we will get it right, or maybe it is not the right time. With time, those failures become blessings. They change our perspective and how we view ourselves and the world around us. Failure can help us to see, understand and be willing to help those who are suffering around us, to have empathy.

Do you have a moment in your life when you say, "If only I had not failed at ______, then my life would be so much better?" In the movie, Mr. Destiny starring Jim Belushi, he plays a guy that dreams about what if he had hit the game winning homerun in a high school baseball game instead of striking out. If he had hit that homerun, his life would have been so much better. And he is given the chance by a magical bartender to live that dream life. But it turns out that his "dream" life is a nightmare. The life that he had after striking out was a good life and he appreciates what he has when he is given the chance to go back to his "old" life. That strikeout turned out to be a blessing, a homerun in its own sort of way.

If it hadn't been for the failures in our lives, we wouldn't be where we are right now. What's even crazier to think about is if our parents hadn't failed, we might not be here. If our grandparents hadn't failed, we might not be here. If our great, great, great to the Nth degree grandparents hadn't failed, we would not be here today, in this place, living this life with all our failures, joys, and blessings. That is humbling and years from now, our descendants will realize the same thing. God takes our struggles, our trials, our tribulations, our failures and turns them into blessings. It may take a while, but it'll happen. In the meantime, we ask God to forgive us for our failures, mistakes, sins and be thankful that he loves us no matter what. Jesus has already taken away our sins, washed us clean and is helping us to learn from failures and lets us know that we are not alone in those times of failure. He is with us, always and forever. Amen.

We can always use towels, sheets, kitchen items, and hygiene items. If the item is in good condition, it is likely that someone can use it. No large electronics or food please.




Summer Fun Series
