PASTOR JEFF'S ARTICLE



Dear Partners in Ministry,

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice.

Psalm 141:2

I'm guessing many of you can relate to having a prayer life that has been more active during certain periods of your life than in others. As a teenager, I had a very good habit of praying right before bed, often for an extended period of time as I prayed for all the important people in my life and the needs of the poor. I'm not sure when it happened, but at some point, that habit eroded. Then when I was in seminary, I was introduced to spiritual guidance, and once again was invigorated in my prayer life...at least for a while. During my first call, I read some books and attended a retreat on contemplative prayer, and once again I found incredible peace and joy from regular times of prayer. But then came a series of life changes, including wartime deployments and the birth of our 4 kids, and my prayer life got put on the back-burner again. And as with most people, my prayer life has intensified around times of personal tragedy or when a loved one has been ill or died. The point is, it's completely normal to have times when prayer is part of a passionate routine and times when it is harder to do. And yet, as 1 Thessalonians says, we are encouraged to "pray without ceasing."

So, this Lent, in a year when the Lord knows we could all use some prayer, we're going to spend the Wednesdays of Lent learning some 'prayer practices.' I believe a prayer practice is just a tool to help us regularly talk to our Lord and Creator in ways that open our hearts and souls to what God has to say to us. It's not about our saying the right thing, but about being open to being in God's presence and to building our relationship with God. I hope you will join us, whether in-person or online as we learn together about several kinds of prayer practices. In the meantime, know that I am praying for all of you and I pray that you may know more fully the love our Lord Jesus Christ has for you!

We are following best practices for keeping folks safe including configuring the sanctuary to ensure social distancing and asking everyone to wear masks.


