PASTOR JEFF'S ARTICLE

"Re-Thinking Stewardship"



"And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full." Matthew 14:20

Grace and peace brothers and sisters in Christ!

Fall is right around the corner and with it churches around the country will be launching "stewardship campaigns." Too often, especially in this time of declining worship attendance and giving, these campaigns have become desperate calls to "meet the budget." And while it's true, just like any other non-profit, churches need donations to keep operating, as Christians our giving shouldn't be based on the church budget. Instead our giving should flow out of a sense of discipleship and a desire to be a part of God's action in the world. I personally believe if every Christian did this, churches and charities would have enough to cover their current budgets, plus an abundance leftover to do other ministry that didn't seem possible. Just as at the Feeding of the 5000, Jesus took five loaves and two fish and fed 1000s and there were 12 baskets leftover, God can do amazing things with what seems like a little today too!

A large research project on what American Christians give to charity, found that if "serious Christians" gave a tithe of 10% and "other church attending Christians" gave 5%, \$133 BILLION dollars MORE, EVERY YEAR, in donations would be received than current giving by those same Christians. That is a staggering number that the researchers pointed out could end world hunger, give homes to the homeless, pay off every church's mortgages and so much more in just the first year! (Currently Lutherans give an average of 1.7% of their income to any charity or church.) I absolutely don't share this to make anyone feel guilty, but to show the amazing potential to better this world we all have.

Our mission as Christians is, believing and trusting we are sons and daughters of God, to help others know they are too, and to work to bring about the full coming of God's kingdom. When we believe all we have is from God, that our God is one of abundance rather than scarcity, and that we are called to bring about God's kingdom, we will want to give generously and joyfully to participate in God's work. When we see the blessings in our lives and the needs of our neighbors, we will want to contribute our time, talents, and finances to not just our church, but to other worthy charities working to make this world a better place for all.

It is my hope as your pastor, that we all will continue to grow as disciples- increased faith and knowledge, increased fellowship with God's people, increased generosity and gratefulness as we work together in this place, to help others experience God's kingdom and Christ's love through all of the ministries we do, such as our support of the school lunch program and the food shelf, the Community Dollar Club, our benevolence to the ELCA for programs like World Hunger and malaria relief, our support of Lutheran Social Services, our Turkey Dinner Baskets, and our support of Luther Point Bible Camp, to name a few. THANK YOU for your past, present and future support of the work we do together. Our shared ministry, through your volunteering and donations, is making a difference in the world!

Here are just a couple examples of how your gifts are at work:






