"He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit." John 15:2 NRSV

Dear Fellow Children of God,

Grace and peace to you from God our Creator and from Jesus Christ, our living Lord and Savior! Last week, I had the opportunity to attend a continuing education event over three days called the FAITHFUL



INNOVATION SUMMIT. I usually say if I take away ONE thing from a continuing education event like this, it was worth the cost and effort. But, I took away SO much more than one thing from this event, which I'll share with you in bits and pieces over the coming months.

At the heart of this summit, and also of our synod's Faithful Innovation Network (which I hope we as a church will join in the coming year), was the idea that our churches are declining due to all kinds of cultural factors and that traditional ways of attracting and keeping "members" no longer "works." So what the church needs to do is get back to the basics of our faith. We need to help connect people's deep longings and losses to what goes on in church. We need to work on connecting to God and to our neighbors. We need to be clear on what's unique about being a Christian. We need to help people make meaning of their lives through faith.

To do all these things, we need to do some pruning- both branches bearing fruit and those that are not, because just like in a garden, you have to prune the branches and deadhead the flowers to make room for new growth. We need to make room for the Spirit to work in this church and in our lives. We can't just add innovation on top of everything we're already doing- we all know we don't have enough volunteers and funds to do all that we currently try to do...so we'll need to prune in order to innovate and follow the Spirit's leading.

There's so much more to say on this topic, but for now I want you to know that this pruning can and should take place in our own lives too. I for one, plan to prune some things off my personal and work to-do lists, so that I can get back to the basics of spiritual practices like contemplative prayer and dwelling in God's Word. Because I know that over the years, the demands of ministry and family life have pulled me away from those key practices that feed my faith and passion and love of Jesus, which in turn make me a less impactful pastor, husband and father.

How about you? Do you need to prune some things to make space to spend time with God and grow in your faith and relationship with Christ? Grab the pruners and join me in making room for the Spirit to work in our congregation and our personal lives. Amen!


Music Director Update




