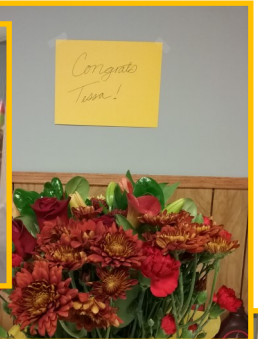

Dear Fellow Children of God,

Last Sunday I gave a talk about our *Northwest Synod of Wisconsin's* initiative called "Faithful Innovations Network" or FIN for short. FIN is a joint project with the 6 synods of Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. It understands that in the twenty-first century, changes in culture and technology have led to widespread shifts in the world around us. These changes affect the church, our communities, and our people.

The network joins churches together in order to seek how to be the church in the twenty-first century. Members of the network are listening to find out what God is up to in our lives, our neighborhoods, and the lives of our neighbors.

This is not a program or a magic bullet solution for all the challenges facing churches today. Instead, it is a process through which congregations can learn more about what God is up to and how we can better listen to God in our context.

If we want to join in the FIN process with other ELCA churches in our region, we need to commit \$450 and a team of 4-10 people willing to commit to:

- Three Training Sessions (Jan. 18, 2020, Apr. 25, 2020, Sep. TBD 2020)
- Once a month coaching
- Experimenting between trainings with new actions designed to help our congregation learn more about what God is doing in our midst and how we can join that work.

If you would be willing to be part of our congregation's FIN team, please contact me ASAP so we can move forward with this most worthy of initiatives. The future of our church may literally depend on our intentionally engaging our community and where God is leading us and I think FIN is a great way to do so. I hope you will join us.

Endowment

Are Children's Education/Sunday School Worth it?

Absolutely! Of course they are. Nothing is more important for the future of our church and our members than the ministry of educating our children and youth about Jesus Christ. However, there are other ministries that need our attention and support as well. Today, our ELC Mission Endowment fund has a total of approximately \$137,000 across three accounts: Children's Education (\$80,000), Women of ELC (\$40,000) and the General account (\$17,000). As you can see, the Children's account is well-funded compared to the General account. This is due to the generous gifts from the Mary Ames and Helen Jacobson estates. Both of these were very specific that their gifts be designated only for Children's Education. This is definitely a worthy ministry that benefits from these generous gifts and we have been able to satisfy almost all distribution requests from Children's Education. Other ministries are not so fortunate.

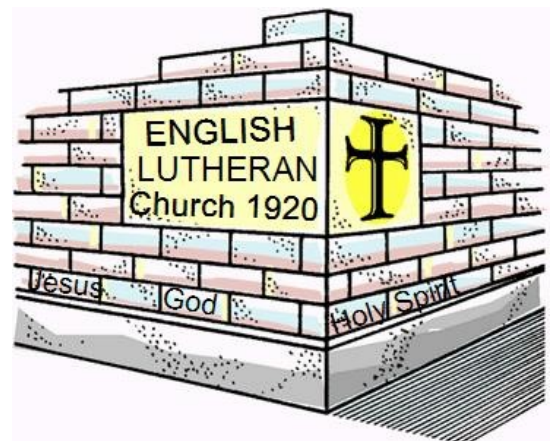


As an example, this quarter we have 6 requests for funds from the ELC Endowment. Of those six requests only one is for Children's Education, a \$300 request to purchase fabric for Prayer Shawls, which we will easily be able to approve and fund. The other five requests are for a variety of worthy ministry projects such as ARC, Graduate Quilts, Young Adults in Global Mission, Thanksgiving Baskets, & Christikon which total over \$800. Unfortunately, we will only be able to fund one or two of these requests because of the limited income that the General Account generates compared to the Children's Education or Women of ELC accounts.

The reason I wrote this article is to alert the congregation to the disparity between the account funds and the limitations we have in satisfying requests from the General account. So what is the solution? Obviously, it is to increase the size of the General account. Therefore, I am asking you to prayerfully consider how you have or plan to designate your will or estate if you are planning to leave a gift to *English Lutheran Church*. I am asking that you give the leaders of our church the flexibility to use the endowment funds to meet the needs of various ministries. You can do this by not designating a specific ministry but rather simply designating your gift to our ELC Endowment. This does two things, it allows us to meet the needs of all our ministries while at the same time preserving your gift as a legacy of thankfulness for the gifts we have received from our heavenly father. Thanks for your prayerful consideration.

Stewardship Update

As of October 21, we have received 26 completed Stewardship Commitment cards out of a total of 150. Approximately 60 cards were picked up at church, the remainder were mailed with the quarterly giving statements. If you have not received a Stewardship card, there are forms available in the office or on the table in the back of the church. The Stewardship Campaign ends on November 24th and our goal is to build up our church with as many bricks as possible. Simply returning your commitment card will add one brick. By increasing your gift from last year, volunteering for any ministry or giving electronically will each add a brick for a total of 4. Your gifts are a recognition of the blessings we have received from God our father who has been generous in many ways to us. Thanks for turning in your Stewardship Commitment card by November 24th.

Women's Bible Study

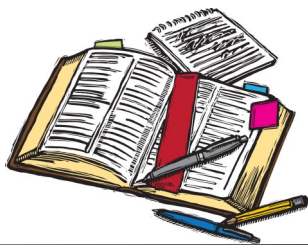
Women's Bible Study will meet Wednesday, Nov. 13 at 10:00 am.

Our next gathering will be Saturday, November 9, 9:00 am to Noon.

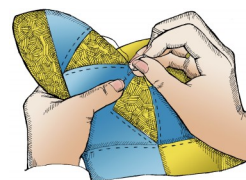
Please join us as we craft together beautiful, handmade quilts for our High School Seniors who will be graduating next May.

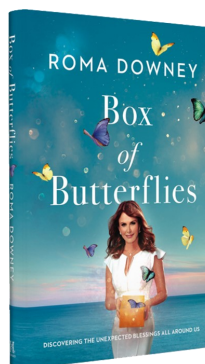

Christikon

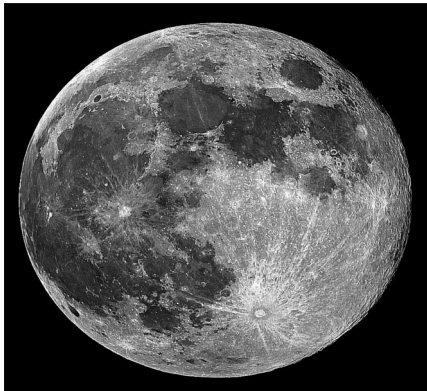

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES & FINANCIAL UPDATE

October Council Minutes

- † Dwelling in the Word/Prayer by Peter Carr. The group read and discussed Luke 18: 1-8 NLT.
- † Offering handling at the end of each service. If two council members are not present, one council member may find a previous council member or another member to help. If no council members are present, two trustworthy members may take the offering to the safe.
- † Sound system. There were three options to choose from. Option B -QSC Touch Mix-30 Pro was chosen. Cost: \$1899.99 (after \$200 rebate) plus \$500 for labor/ installation/testing and training by Brickhouse. May need another \$20-100 for cable upgrade. Funds for the new system to come from (line 824 in dedicated accounts) Music Misc. at \$2,183.66 with remaining funds to be covered by special appeal.
- † South Property Possibilities. Discussed setting up a group to discuss ideas for the property such as memorials. No action taken.
- † *Faithful Innovations Network* Update: Pastor Jeff will address this at the October 20 services. Follow up at November council meeting.
- † Fair Stand Funds. Motion to move \$4000 from the Fair Stand Funds to Youth Ministry Funds (line 839 in dedicated accts) and move \$15,000 to the General Funds from the Fair Stand Funds.
- † Gary Onan motioned for \$100 from *Thrivent Choice Dollars* (line 836 in dedicated accts.) go to *Ellsworth National Child Safety Program*. MSC.

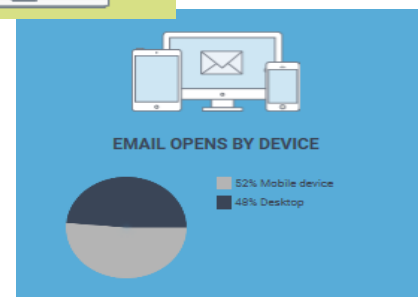

3. I am the group contact. The group is limited to 30. The first 30 registrations with \$100 deposits received will be accepted.

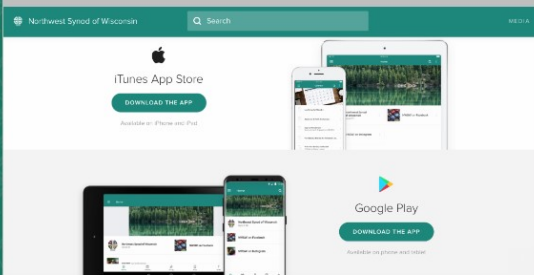
