PASTOR JEFF'S ARTICLE



SHARE TESUS

"Look, here is the Lamb of God!" John 1:36

Grace & peace siblings in Christ!

I recently gave a sermon centered on evangelism. Because this topic is so important, and in case you missed it, here's a Cliff Notes version!

I'd much rather be a faithful pastor and have 50 in worship, then to be a false prophet with 5000. But on the other hand, we as Christians are called to share the good news with others, and as a church, if we aren't growing, we are dying. So while numbers alone don't tell the whole story, we can't ignore them either. Especially in a time when almost all churches are declining. Perhaps one of the greatest threat to the future of not just ELC, but the whole Lutheran Church, is our fear of evangelism, that is, sharing our faith with others in hopes they might believe too.

Some of that fear's justified. We've all had someone try to make us doubt our eternal destiny with questions like, "Are you saved?" Or "Do you have a personal relationship w/ Jesus?" And because we don't want to be "one of them," we do the complete opposite, and instead "keep it private" and tell NO ONE about our faith. But does Jesus really want us to keep our faith private? Is the Gospel supposed to be a secret that only "special people" who happen to be born into Christian families get to hear? I don't think so. Thankfully, the 1st chapter of John gives us a model for sharing our faith.

The first step to sharing your faith is to **NOTICE** God working in your life, just like John the Baptist did. Each day, spend a couple of minutes noticing where you saw or felt the presence of God in your life. Or if that's too difficult, each day name the places in the world where you think God needs to be like in the tragedies you see on the news or with a family you know that's struggling in some way.

The second step is to **SHARE** your faith, like Andrew did with his brother Simon in John 1. Share with other people why you like coming to ELC, what the people here mean to you, and what your faith in Jesus means to you.

The third step is to **INVITE** people you know to come to church with you. Now, I know this can feel awkward if you've never done it before. But, most of us have invited friends or neighbors or co-workers to dinner, or a movie, a sporting event or a party because we like spending time with them and we want them to experience with us, something we value or enjoy. In fact, we're pretty good at inviting people to all of those things, so why not do the same with church and our faith?

To consider:

Who do you know that might enjoy the same things about church and Jesus as you?
Who else in your life might need to know they are loved by our Creator?
Who else might need strength & comfort in the hard times of life?
Who do you know with a desire to serve others and be an agent for positive



Who do you know with a desire to serve others and be an agent for positive change in this world?

Share with those people why going to church is so important and valuable to you, and then invite them to come with you to church.

Dastor's PASTOR JEFF'S ARTICLE & CHURCH NEWS

This is SO important, because you all are better ambassadors of the faith than I am as a pastor.

Study after study shows that the reason most people join a new church is because *someone they know* invited them. I can go knock on 100 doors and

maybe get 1 or 2 new families to join us. But if all 100-140 worshippers in ELC on any given Sunday invited just one friend, neighbor, classmate, coworker, or family member without a church to come to ELC, not only could we nearly double the size of our church, more importantly we'd be giving them the gift of belonging to this family and of knowing & experiencing God's grace, peace & forgiveness in Jesus.

Jesus today told John's disciples to "come & see" what he was doing and where he was going. Jesus also called all of us to "make disciples of all nations." Heed both of those calls & be God's messengers this month, as you **NOTICE** where God is acting, **SHARE** the good news with others and **INVITE** them to "come & see" that God is good, and desires to be part of their lives too.



Dear friends of Malawi,

Grace and peace to you; I hope you are all well.

As we look with hope toward this new year, I would like to share a few updates about our partnership with Malawi.

20 for 20 Well Campaign

Last year, during a visit from the Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Malawi, we revealed a plan to celebrate our 20 years in ministry together by launching a campaign with the goal of raising \$20,000 during 2019. If reached, there would be enough funds to build two deep-drilled bore wells in Malawi. With an overwhelming response, the synod surpassed this goal and raised **\$45,816.20**. Together, your generosity has provided enough funds to drill four wells, bringing access to clean, safe drinking water to four areas in need. THANK YOU!

2019 Visits

In March of 2019, Bishop Joseph Bvumbwe and his wife Maria visited our synod for two weeks, and became reacquainted with Wisconsin blizzards. During their time here, they participated in Walking Together, visited congregations, friends, and ministries throughout the synod, and participated in a South African Consultation Gathering at the ELCA churchwide office in Chicago.

During the summer months, two groups from Northwest Wisconsin visited Malawi - the first group from Immanual Lutheran in Eau Claire visited their parish partners in Zomba, and the second group visited several ELCM feeding, education, and health ministries.

Upcoming Visits

In April of this year, Bishop Laurie Skow-Anderson, Rev. Randy Olson (Synod Minister), Savannah Small (Synod Youth Board President), and Deacon Laura Ramlow (Synod Minister), will be traveling to Malawi to teach at the Pastors' Academy, build relationships with our partners in the ELCM, experience the culture of the country, and travel to Johannesburg for an ELCA/Southern Africa Consultation. This gathering will be a time for ELCA synods and their southern African church partners to meet for dialogue about issues of gender, climate change, Lutheran identity, and youth and young adults. These important conversations are designed to enrich the ways we share the gospel together, and compel us to respond faithfully, as the church, to the injustices in our contexts.

Social Concerns

Heavy on the hearts of our Malawian brothers and sisters right now are the many demonstrations (protests) happening throughout the country. As they wait for the court verdict from last May's controversial presidential election, let us pray for peace, something that The Warm Heart of Africa has long been known for.

Please join me in praying for God's continued blessings on our partnership with the ELCM as we look forward to all the ways we will walk together in the light of Jesus Christ. **Zikomo Yesu!**


