What Worship Means For Us

Starting on August 7th we at English Lutheran will be worshiping at one worship service at 9:00 AM. This is a two month trial (August-September) with the Council conferring on September 20th on whether to make this change more permanent.

So, we are advertising the format for this worship as 'blended'. This means that we can expect to find a mix of traditional hymns and praise songs at each worship service. We will have a traditional liturgy on some Sundays and a more free flowing format on others. All worship will feature a Sermon (the Word) and Communion (the Sacrament).

All Christian worship has at least five elements which might differ in style but not in substance. They are:

- a) entering with God's name and praise
- b) reading from the Bible and proclaiming God's Word (a message)
- c) announcing our Faith in God and asking for (praying) for ourselves and others
- d) sharing the meal and baptism according to the command of Jesus
- e) a challenge to go out into the world with God's blessing.

These five parts of public worship have been a part of God's church from the first century after Jesus death and resurrection. They might look and sound different in a traditional and contemporary setting, but they are the essential elements of Christian worship. The leader can invite us to approach Almighty God with formal (Thee-Thou) language which invokes respect, or familiar ("We just want to praise your name") language invoking the comfort of Jesus our Friend and companion through life. They both count as prayer.

In churches throughout the world, each congregation seeks an opportunity to combine elements to make a meaningful connection in the hearts of young and older worshippers. We at English Lutheran have been doing this by separating the style of worship at 8:30 AM traditional worship and 10:00 AM Contemporary worship. According to our survey 80% of our worshipers feel that we would benefit from being together in a combined worship (at 9 AM) with fellowship, Sunday School, and Choir practice at 10:00 AM. This will give Sunday School teachers and Choir members more time to practice which will make our worship service more inspiring for all members.

Please bear with us as we lean into this change in our Sunday celebration. We hope this change will re-energize our worship to bring New Life as we look forward to welcoming a new Pastor and leader in the months ahead!
