



"Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth." Psalm 100:1

Thank you very much to everyone who filled out a worship survey! Over 70 people responded to our survey and almost 75% preferred that we stick with one worship service. This means that **for the time being**, we will stick with one worship service on Sunday mornings. This is not set in stone for all eternity. We will listen to the Holy Spirit and follow what she is telling us to do. In fact, I hope that someday, we will have another worship service (or two) each week. For the time being, let us come together as a family in Christ as we rebuild from the struggles of the past few years.

On the survey, there were many comments about the different styles of worship and music and the Worship & Music Committee will take them to heart. We will meet soon to discuss the style and format of our worship services. Missy and Ava are amazing worship leaders and I love working with them!! Part of the struggle has been that I started in the middle of November and we jumped right into the Advent & Christmas season. It could be said that we were flying by the seat of our pants, but now we have a moment to catch our breath and begin planning for Lent and future worship services. Worshipping God is my favorite part of being a pastor and I am excited to work with a team to bring our best praises to God.

Having one service offers us the chance to worship and praise God in different styles. We aren't pigeon-holed into one style or the other each week and God does not prefer the styles either. In Psalm 100:1, we simply told "Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth!" There are many ways that we can praise God and make a joyful noise to the Lord and I look forward to exploring all the different ways that we can praise the Lord! Prior to becoming a minister, I spent 11 summers and 3 retreat seasons working at four different Lutheran Bible camps. One of my goals at camp was to incorporate parts of the liturgy into our bible camp worship services to show how bible camp blends with Sunday mornings in our churches. In the churches, I have had fun mixing in the experiential parts of the bible camp worship into the Sunday morning worship services and I look forward to continuing that with you. At camp worship service, parts like the confession and forgiveness included actions and visuals to help the campers to see how God loves them and forgives them. I plan on showing you just what I'm talking about in the near future.

In the meantime, let us come together and make a joyful noise to the Lord, no matter what style of worship service we are using on Sunday mornings. I love worshipping with you and sharing the Word of God with you. Every Sunday morning is an honor and a privilege for me to be your pastor. Thank you for calling me to English Lutheran Church to be your pastor!!
