Attitude of Gratitude

When I graduated from high school, my parents hosted a big party at their house. We invited all our family, friends, and neighbors to come to the house for food and beverages. We cooked so much food, way too much food. So much in fact, that when I came home for Thanksgiving break, mom was pulling pans out of the freezer of leftover graduation food for us to eat. That was awe-some! The other great thing was all the gifts and cards that I received from the guests. That was really awesome! But it also meant that I had to say thank you. When we ordered my invitations, Mom also ordered the Thank You cards for me to send out after the party. And that stack of Thank You cards with the list of gifts sat on the dining room table forever. All summer long, Mom would "remind" me that I needed to do my thank you cards. It was weird, it was awkward, and I didn't like doing it, so rarely did I ever do it again. But it always gnawed at me in the back of my mind, that I should send out a Thank You card after I received a gift.

When I finally gave up the fight and listened to God and went off to seminary to study to become a minister. People from back home were extremely excited and they were generous with their cards and well-wishes as I left home and went back to school. I had a list of people that I needed to send a thank you to and eventually I did send out a letter. It was amazing to see how many people said thank you for the thank you! It brought a nice, warm fuzzy feeling to my heart. But something more important changed within me as I was writing those thank you notes, it helped me to see the blessings in my life, rather than focusing on the bad things. My mood changed as I wrote those thank you notes. It is hard to be angry or sad when you are focusing on something good that is happening. In Alcoholics Anonymous, we call this an Attitude of Gratitude. When we look for the good things in life, we find them. If all we focus on is the bad, then that is what we will find. Unfortunately, in our world today, there are many people who are making a lot of money by making us feel bad about anything and everything. If you spend all your time watching the news, you will be driven mad by all the bad things that they tell us about. And they make money by making us angry and outraged by what other people are doing. They sell ads and we get a rush from the anger that we are feeling. So, we watch more of it, and they sell more ads and make more money. Meanwhile, the ads are telling us that something is wrong with us and if we just buy the product that they are selling, then we will be happy. And we gobble it down, buy it up, and soak it into our brains. And we cannot figure out why we are more miserable and even poorer than we were before we bought this, that, or the other thing.

Our world tells us to focus on the bad because it has figured out how to make money on that. I'm not saying that we need to be Pollyanna or think that the entire world is bubblegum and rainbows, because we are human. There is bad stuff out there, BUT there is also a ton of great things out there too!! If we turn off our TVs, put down our phones, close our laptops, turn off the talk-radio, we can begin to create space for us to see the good in our lives and in our world. We can begin to see the blessings in our lives. I encourage you, grab a piece of paper or a thank you note and say a quick thank you, or even send a note saying Hi to a long-lost friend. You may never know what that note means to the recipient, it may change their day for the better. I do know who will change, YOU! By bringing a little gratitude into our lives. Now, brothers and sisters in Christ, may the peace of God that passes all human understanding, may it guard your hearts and minds in Christ.
