Dear Partners in Ministry,

When 2020 began, few of us would've guessed at how different a year it would become. I've thought a lot about all the changes over the last 4+ months, including last week while at Christikon, a Lutheran Bible Camp in the mountains of Montana. I continue to process all that I'm learning through the effects of this pandemic, but here are just two beliefs that COVID-19 has reinforced.

1. The church is not the building. Like all of you, I miss gathering together to worship in the sanctuary at English Lutheran. And yet, despite not being able to do that at this time, ministry continues. I could fill up this article with all the ways, but a small sampling includes: weekly online worship and now parking lot worship, financial gifts (to the ELCA, Luther Point, LSS, Malawi, and Ellsworth school lunches), pastoral care by phone and mail, and our youth who attended summer camp at Christikon. We are blessed with a church building that is paid for in full...and yet, all we really need is the people who gather in it. Church building or not, we can continue to:

- pray for one another, our community and our world
- worship our Lord (no matter the setting)
- love our neighbors however we can
- pass on our faith to our children and to those who have not yet heard the Good News

Just as ministry at ELC has been a bit different this spring and summer, the program at Christikon had some notable changes (like quarantining for 2 weeks prior to camp, no folk dancing, no holding hands or hugging, no singing grace indoors, being served our food rather than passing bowls, wearing face masks indoors and when singing outdoors, and of course washing and sanitizing hands repeatedly throughout the day.) And despite all that, camp was comfortably familiar too- we still hiked, worshipped, performed skits, gathered around tables to eat, played games, did service projects, joked and laughed, studied God's Word, and grew together as the body of Christ. Through it all, it was the presence of God and God's people that truly made it special. I hope whenever this pandemic is finally over, we will remember church is really about God and the people, and not the building or programs.

2. Most of us have been overlooked. While this pandemic has added all kinds of additional or changed duties to my pastoral job description that consume a ton of my time, it's also meant the cancellation of many in-person meetings, youth events, and other events that keep my family and me on the go. I'm sure you all can relate! But I've found most (not all of course) of those cancellations to be a blessing. For the first time since the first of my four children was born over 12 years ago, I'm home for supper more nights than I'm away. And the nights I am home, I'm no longer scarfing down dinner and running out the door to get the kids to sports or scouts. Since everyone else in the neighborhood is in the same boat, I'm actually getting to know neighbors I never had time to talk to before and it has been wonderful! Kids are actually out playing in their yards! Parents, and often pets, are actually going for walks! Neighbors who never mingled are having campfires together in the driveway or their yard. I pray we will not feel compelled to fill our schedules to the brim again when this is all over. This pandemic has reinforced my belief we are meant to be human "beings" and not human "doings" which in part is why God tells us in Psalm 46, "Be still and know that I am God."

Certainly there is much bad that has come from this pandemic, including the death of at least 143,000 of our fellow Americans so far. We grieve for all those lives lost and all the other negative effects of COVID-19. But I pray we can appreciate and seek out the good things too, including coming together as siblings in Christ to support one another and grow in our faith and having a little more time to build relationships with friends, neighbors, and family and be still in God's presence. God bless you always!

OUTDOOR WORSHIP IN THE PARKING LOT OF ENGLISH LUTHERAN **SUNDAYS at 8:30 & 10 AM. ****

** Unless cancelled due to a spike in COVID-19 cases or weather.

If you plan to attend our outdoor worship, you should know:

UNDERLYING CONDITION OR OVER AGE 65? If you are at-risk for COVID-19 (65 years-old or older or have an underlying condition) please consider staying home for your own safety.

FEELING ILL? If you feel ill or have symptoms similar to COVID-19, PLEASE STAY HOME.

MASKS: We **strongly encourage** everyone to please wear a mask at the service. (Exceptions can be made for those with a medical condition like asthma or anxiety associated with wearing a mask and those under age 5.) Remember, it's not about protecting yourself so much as it is about showing love to your neighbor by protecting them from your breathing/coughing/sneezing if you are an asymptomatic carrier of COVID. Please bring your own mask. We will have a limited supply for those who don't have one.

CHAIRS: Please bring your own chair, if possible, to reduce the sanitizing we have to do after worship. We will have a limited supply of folding chairs for those who don't have one or can't physically bring their own.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING: Please come only with those who live in your household and sit together as a household AT LEAST 6 feet from any other household and AT LEAST 15 feet from the worship leaders in the front. Follow instructions from our ushers on where to sit.

Also, please keep at least 6 feet away from other households at all times when not seated- we know you want to hug and shake hands, but we simply can't take the risk at this time. There will intentionally be no hospitality time or receiving line. We kindly ask you to head home as soon as the service is over.

50 PERSON LIMIT: We will limit attendance to 50 people per Pierce County Health guidance. If attendance is high, we will add a service or take reservations for future services.

OFFERING: There will be an offering basket between where you park your car and the seating area in the parking lot. Of course, you can always give electronically online as well.

SINGING: There will be no singing as singing has been identified as a highly risky activity due to the aerosols it creates. Music will be instrumental or "special" pre-recorded singing. You may hum along if you wish!

COMMUNION: We will not be offering communion initially. If the first few weeks of outdoor worship go well, we may provide communion at a later date with many safety precautions.

WEATHER: We will hold the outdoor service unless there is severe weather or rain heavier than a mist. If we have to cancel, online worship will still be available. Check our website, Facebook or our church voicemail after 9 pm Saturday to see if worship has been cancelled.

CONTACT TRACING: We will be collecting contact info and seating locations of worshippers for contact tracing in case someone at our services, later tests positive with COVID-19.

Church Fair Stand

Unfortunately the *Pierce County Fair* has been cancelled this summer, so we will not have our annual gathering and won't be able to serve our famous Roast Beef Dinners - I know - makes the taste buds water... We're gonna have to wait until next year!

Thank you to all who are usually deep in planning this time of year and cleaning out the fair stand and calling volunteers... Thank you to all of our volunteers who give of their time each year so we can share those dinners with our community. We appreciate you all and will miss our fellowship.



Ushers Needed!

As we move forward with outdoor worship, and later indoor worship, we need a specially trained team of ushers to direct people where to sit, explain traffic flow, point out our offering box, collect contact info, dismiss groups at the end of the service, direct cars where to park, set up a few chairs and possibly do light cleaning of handrails, door knobs, etc. If you are able to be part of a team of ideally 4-6 ushers at each service, please contact our Music Director Evan Mitchell (music@englishlutheranchurch.org) soon so we can get you trained before our first outdoor service. Thanks for your assistance to help us try to keep worship safe and flow smoothly for everyone.


